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How we will do it

If you would like a festival artist to perform a workshop to your school:

- Artists can run workshops for your school from Monday 18th to Friday 22nd November, depending on the artist's availability. Artists will be booked for a school for minimum half a day, and they can offer up to 2 workshops per half a day. If booked for a whole day, they can offer 3 workshops, and up to 4 depending on the format of the workshop.
- Each workshop is limited to groups of up to 25-30 children. Workshops will generally last for one hour. The workshop is happening under the teacher's supervision.
- Festival artists will be paid directly by IFRU following the French Charter for children's book artists (± 400 a full day, ± 250 half day). The IFRU will invoice you for artists participation in your school.
- For book orders: see p.4 to know more about **our two partner bookshops**.
- If they wish to see more of the artists, children can visit the Institut français with their parents during the weekend for real workshops. More info on our website: www.southkenkidsfestival.co.uk

JOSEPH COELHO



Joseph Coelho OBE, Fellow of the Royal Society of Literature and Children's Laureate for 2022-2024, is a performance poet, children's author and playwright. Joe has written plays for the Polka Theatre, Soho Theatre and the Unicorn Theatre and creates dynamic poetry theatre pieces for young people that he tours nationally. He also performs around the country with the UK's top performance poetry organisation, Apples and Snakes. Joseph has also been a guest poet on CBeebies Rhyme Rocket.

Workshop 1: Presenting the YA verse novel and winner of the 2024 Carnegie Medal for writing, The Boy Lost in the Maze

Year 9 + | Quatrième + | In English | 45 minutes

Join 2022-2024 Children's Laureate Joseph Coelho as he discusses his inspirations behind this award-winning verse novel that intertwines the stories of three boys - Theseus from Ancient Greece, modern Londoner Theo and The Minotaur. This 'Choose-your-Adventure' novel interrogates toxic masculinity and what it means to be a man as we follow Theo's and Theseus' journeys as they try to find their biological fathers across time and space, overcoming the hurdles of murderers and monsters. Joseph will dive into the peculiarities of writing verse novels and how poetry, both structured and free verse, can be used to tell a story.

Translated into thirty languages, the story of this one-and-a-half-millimetre tall hero garnered resounding success among both the public and critics. Since then, his works have captivated readers of all ages, taking them on adventures filled with imagination, emotion, and poetry, and highlighting the omnipotence of childhood.


In Timothée de Fombelle's Workshop



Jean-Luc Fromental is a translator, writer and publisher, with extensive involvement in TV, cinema, and comics. Beginning his career at Jean-Claude Lattès, he soon transitioned to writing, co-authoring his first novel, Le Système de l'homme mort. His career then moved into comics, where he held editorial roles at Métal Hurlant magazine. Fromental has authored children's books like Oops! and 365 Penguins and scripted awardwinning films, including "Loulou, l'incroyable secret," which earned the César award for animation in 2014.

Workshop: Stop motion animation workshop

Years 4-12 | CM1 - 1ère | In French and In English | 3 hours | £360


Based on your choice of either *Peut-être que le monde* by Alain Serres and Chloé Fraser or *The Colour Monster* by Ana Llenas, pupils will work in teams of two to write a scenario based on a scene of the chosen book. Each team's scenes will then be assembled to create a final film, bringing the book to life in stop motion form.

Materials needed:

- iPads with iMovie or Stop Motion Studio installed (x15)

She is recognised as one of the leading artists in children's publishing, and many of her books have been translated into many languages.


Workshop 1: art and anatomy for children!

- •Coloured and black markers




Workshop 2: meet Joëlle Jolivet and Miss Cat!

Year 7+ | Sixième+ | in English | 45 mins-1h


After a 30-minute talk and Q&A with Patrice Lawrence, try to create original characters through short writing exercises prompted by extracts from Lawrence's own teenage diary.


Workshop 2: Understanding empathy with Bridget Marzo and Mo's Best Friend, A Stone Age Story


Years 3-11 | CE1- seconde | in French | 1 to 2 hours

Workshop 1: Art in the shadows with Amandine Piu

Years 3-6 | CE1-CM2 | in French | 1h-1h30

Get a flashlight and jump into the world of *Tout noir* by Amandine Piu! Let your imagination run wild as you decorate a Leporello from scratch and discover your creations in the shadows...

Materials needed:

- •7 Airplac black cardboard sheets (70 x 100 cm 5 mm), available at https://www.geant-beaux-arts.fr/airplac-black.html
- •1 pair of scissors per pupil
- Scalpels / cutters
- Pencils and rubbers
- •Glue sticks and transparent scotch tape (to share)
- •Block of 200g A4 black paper (1 or 2 sheets per pupil)
- •White pens, white 0,7 posca markers, white coloured pencils to share (can also be brought by Amandine herself)

Workshop 3: Decoupage and glueing for little ones

Reception-Year 1 | MS-GS | in French | 1h

With inspiration from *Bonjour bestioles* and *Georges géant*, even the youngest pupils can use cut and glued papers to harness their inner creativity!

Materials needed:

- •Coloured A4 paper (different colours)
- •1 sheet of A3 paper per pupil
- •1 glue stick / bottle of liquid glue per pupil
- •Markers and coloured pencils

Workshop 2: Creating a class Leporello with Amandine Piu

Years 2-6 | CP-CM2 | in French | 1h

Put on your listening caps, warm up your imagination, and find a flashlight to attend a live reading of *Tout noir* by Amandine Piu ... in the dark! You'll then be able to create with your classmates one big accordion book with your own cut-outs and silhouettes to bring the Leporello to life.

Materials needed:

- •1 pair of scissors per pupil
- Pencils and rubbers
- •Glue sticks and transparent scotch tape
- •Block of 300g A4 black paper (1 or 2 sheets per pupil)
- •A few white pens and coloured pencils to share (can also be brought by Amandine herself)

Bodies and Stories: A Creative Writing Workshop

Year 8+ | 5ème + | in English or French | one to two hours | 8-12 students and 2-3 adult supervisors

Our bodies hold the secrets of our stories, carrying memories and emotions that shape who we are. Our bodies are fragile and frustrating, yet they can also surprise us with things we didn't know they could do. Through a series of creative prompts and discussions, we'll try to listen to what bodies have to say, explore physical sensations — and probably invent a couple of yoga poses. For curious minds, imperfect bodies and budding writers.




Workshop: Sea Creatures with Chloe Savage



Workshop: "Equality, Community, Diversity"

Year 6-13 | CM2-Terminale | In English | 1 day | free or £100/class

We are glad to bring back the Multilingual Poetry Slam for the 8th year edition! A Poetry Slam is a competitive event (think X Factor but without the mean judges) where poets are judged on their skills as writers as well as performers. Now add poetry written in multiple languages that students are studying at school or know from home!

This experience is a self-contained activity lasting a day: students from different schools and year groups work on group poems in the morning; they practise their performance skills after lunch; and perform their poems on stage in the afternoon in front of a panel of judges including professional poets, publishers and a member of the audience. The Poetry slam is always warm, rowdy and fun. Historically, this format was used to make poetry accessible to all, so all styles are welcome!

Benefits for students

- Literacy skills: creative writing in English, confidence in speaking in public and developing fluidity and spontaneity in a foreign language. Self-esteem and emotional literacy: expressing and talking about feelings and thoughts.
- Metalinguistic skills: switching between different languages and translating, comparing linguistic structures. Collaborative skills working with students from other schools and backgrounds. Use of GCSE and A Level topic in a meaningful and creative way.
